## *Tidings from the Rector*

Sisters and Brothers,

The day after Easter marked the beginning of the Season after Pentecost, the longest season of the church year, that will take us through the rest of Spring, all of Summer, and then nearly to Winter. Except for feast days, the color of the day remains green, prompting the sobriquet, “Long, Green Season.”

Traditionally, non-feast days in the long, green season are known as “Ordinary Time,” but not because they are necessarily commonplace or predictable. (The non-feast days between Epiphany and Ash Wednesday are ordinary, too.) The name is tied to the readings of the Ordinary Roman Rite and refers to the numbering of Sabbath days.

Because of the lack of feast days, and the heat of summer, the pace of the L.G.S. is slower than the rest of the year, allowing time to finish old projects or begin new ones, or perhaps pay attention to work that needs to be done around the rectory. And there are books I’d like to read, and of course, barbeque and music.

I’m also looking forward to a long trip home sometime late in the season, with a side trip to visit with my daughters and their families. It all sounds pretty wonderful to me, and I welcome the Long Green Season this year.

I’ve just been looking over the new Hungars Cure Website. I like it. It’s light and inviting, it made me feel like I’d be welcome, were I visiting the shore. And that’s just what we need.
